Nationally, **less than 1%** of high school students receive full-ride scholarships.



60% of EST students received full-ride scholarships to Northwestern, Morehouse, Hampton, USC, UCLA, Santa Clara, Loyola-Marymount, Notre Dame, etc.



Ninety-six percent (96%) of EST Scholars are on track to graduate from college, compared to 41% of African Americans nationwide.



Scholars Raymond Gravely, Charles Guess, and Amerachi Ajie received full-ride leadership scholarships from the Posse Foundation.



Scholars Josue Rodriguez and Stacy Corzo received a full-ride QuestBridge scholarship to attend Notre Dame University.
